WINTER 2022: TERM A (January 3 - February 13)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

New Testament Survey (BS101)

A study covering the time from the close of the Old Testament through the Revelation. This course is designed to give the student a working knowledge of the background of the New Testament, surveying content as well as the historical setting of each book of the New Testament.

A Study of I & II Corinthians (BS305)

This course will provide a detailed and in-depth exposition of I Corinthians and an overview of II Corinthians. This study will examine the writer, the date and time, and the theme and purpose of each book, as well as its practical application today.

Leadership Fundamentals (LD362)

This course provides a very candid and informative look at the character of the person God uses. Embracing the axiom that genuine relationship with God and integrity are the most important principles in the life of a leader, this course will emphasize the character and integrity of a leader in the body of Christ, as well as guidelines for personal growth and development.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

Introduction to Typology: The Tabernacle (TH509)

This course will cover the structure and symbolism of Israel's tabernacle and the priesthood. Special emphasis will be given to Old Testament types and shadows and their New Testament reality and meaning, providing a vivid revelation of Christ and his finished work.

Values and Ethics (LD562)

This study will seek to establish Biblical fundamentals of leadership. With an understanding that the Biblical leader leads from character before skill, the student will examine the core values and ethics of the individual whom God chooses to use.

DOCTORAL LEVEL COURSES (Special 12 Week Session)

Advanced Hermeneutics (TH603) ***DOCTORAL COURSE: 12 Week Session***

A study of the methods of Biblical interpretation; this course teaches the student the principles of rightly dividing the Word of Truth.

Pneumatology: Doctrine of the Holy Spirit (TH712) ***DOCTORAL COURSE: 12 Week Session***

Pneumatology: The Doctrine of the Holy Spirit. A study of the nature and ministry of the Holy Spirit, including the person, works, and gifts of the Spirit.

WINTER 2022: TERM B (January 17 - February 27)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

The Pastoral Epistles: 1-2 Timothy, Titus (BS201)

This study of the Pastoral Epistles will provide an understanding of New Testament leadership and church government. Particular attention will be given to the 5-fold ministry, and their relationship and calling to the body of Christ.

Stand Firm (BS307) ***<u>NEWCOURSE</u>***

A detailed and in-depth study of the letters of I-III John and Jude. A major emphasis in these letters is standing firm in the faith and in truth. While emphasizing the authority and superiority of Christ, this study will deal with the dangers of false teachings and unbelief among Christians, while presenting a message of encouragement and hope for all believers.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

Comparative Religions (PH501)

An exploration of some of the various religions of the world, including pseudo-Christian cults, the occult and mystical religions, and other religions not related to Christianity. Discussion will include certain key teachings of each religion discussed, as well as the particular strategies and methods used in appeal, solicitation, and recruitment.

Exposition of I-III John & Jude (BS527) ***<u>N E W C O U R S E</u>***

This study will provide an expositional study of the letters of I-III John and Jude. This study will examine the writer, the date and time, and the theme and purpose of each book, as well as its practical application today.

WINTER 2022: TERM C (January 31 - March 13)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

The Pentateuch: Genesis - Deuteronomy (BS107)

A study of the first five books of the Bible. A special emphasis will be given to creation, the seed of Christ, and the covenant. This study will provide a good understanding of the plan of God for man.

Theology of the Reformers (TH416)

An examination of the theology and teachings of the leaders of the Reformation, which helped formulate Protestant theology and doctrine. Upon completion, students should have a better understanding and grasp of the major theological strands coming out of the time of the Reformation which continue to have an influence on the Church today.

Principles of Christian Character (PM304)

All qualities of the fruit of the Spirit compose a unity, and should be evident in the life of each believer. Spiritual fruit is not merely produced by the human nature, but by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23; 2 Peter 1:3-4). This course will provide a good understanding of the fruit of the Spirit and a genuine appreciation for the joy and blessing of living a Spirit-led life.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

Reformation Theology (TH516)

A study of the theology of major reformers such as Luther, Calvin, Zwingli, and Arminius, which shaped current theological thought and belief; this course will enhance the student's understanding and knowledge of foundational theology.

The Fruit of the Spirit (PM514)

A detailed and in-depth study of the fruit of the Spirit, which places emphasis upon the importance of the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer, personal commitment and the importance of living a Spirit-led life. The character of a true believer is examined.

WINTER 2022: TERM D (February 14 - March 27)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

The Dynamics of the Holy Spirit (TH101)

Pneumatology: A Biblical examination of the person, work, gifts, and ministry of the Holy Spirit. Special emphasis is placed on the ministry of the Holy Spirit today.

A Study of Romans (BS304)

An analytical and expositional study of the book of Romans. Special emphasis will be placed upon the historical content of the book, its purpose and doctrinal themes, as well as its practical application in the lives of believers today.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

Theology of Man (TH503)

The Doctrine of Man: This course will examine the doctrine of man; his origin, nature, purpose, and destiny. Particular attention will be given to the fall of man and salvation through the finished work of Christ.

Prevailing Prayer & Worship (LD512)

This course will explore the principles of prayer, emphasizing the relationship of prayer and worship. We will examine the dynamic and effectual prayer life that emanates from the deep and personal spiritual relationship of the believer who spends time with God and is captivated by His heart and purposes.
