Exploring the Supernatural: Angelology (TH103)

An exploration of the realm of the supernatural, including the origin, purpose, and ministry of angels. This study will also reveal the fall of angels, who is the devil, where did the demons come from, and the battle that rages today in the spirit-world.

Church History (TH104)

An exploration of the history of the Christian church. Discussion will include the early development of the church, great revivals and movements, and many important historical events as pertaining to the church.

The Unimpaired Conscience (TH445-TH545)

The gospel of Christ conflicts with the spirit of the age and differs sharply and decisively with secular worldview and culture (2 Cor. 4:1-4; Eph. 2:1-2), and yet Christians are instructed to seek God's kingdom with a pure heart, a clear conscience, and sincere faith (1 Timothy 1:5). This course will examine life from the kingdom perspective, and instruct the Christian on how to live in this world and yet, not be of the world (John 17:15-21; 1 Peter 2:11; 1 John 2:15).

Reformation Theology: Theology of the Reformers (TH416-TH506)

A study of the theology of major reformers such as Luther, Calvin, Zwingli, and Arminius, which shaped current theological thought and belief; this course will enhance the student's understanding and knowledge of foundational theology.

The Minor Prophets (BS404-BS514)

A study of the historical and prophetic writings of the twelve prophets from Hosea to Malachi. This study will examine the writer, historical background, and the purpose and theme of each book.

The Dynamics of the Holy Spirit: Intro to Pneumatology (TH101-Th589)

Pneumatology: A Biblical examination of the person, work, gifts, and ministry of the Holy Spirit. Special emphasis is placed on the ministry of the Holy Spirit today.

The Gospels: Matthew / Mark / Luke / John (BS306-BS506)

With a focus on the Gospel of John, this course will provide a chronological overview of the life of Christ and a comparison of each of the four New Testament Gospels.

God's Plan for Man: Dispensational Theology (TH303-TH515)

Anthropology: This course will examine and outline in detail God's plan for man, beginning with the creation, the development and fall of man, as well as God's detailed plan for man's restoration. This course will provide an overview of God's eternal plan for the ages concerning man and the earth.

A Study of James (BS106)

James is one of the most direct and practical writers of the New Testament, providing a valuable understanding of the problems facing many of the early Jewish believers. This detailed and in-depth study will explore the background, purpose, and practical application of this powerful and interesting book, and will leave the student with a renewed faith in our Lord

Great Bible Doctrines (BS102)

The principles of the faith will be examined in this course as we examine in depth the major doctrines of the Bible. Essential doctrines such as the doctrine of God, the Scriptures, the finished work of Christ, the Holy Spirit, eschatology, and many more will be studied in detail.

Bible History/Bibliology: The Origin of our Bible (TH301-TH531)

Bibliology: This course examines evidences that validate the divine origin and revelation of the Bible, its authenticity, inspiration, canonicity, and inerrancy.

A Study of Romans (BS304)

An analytical and expositional study of the book of Romans. Special emphasis will be placed upon the historical content of the book, its purpose and doctrinal themes, as well as its practical application in the lives of believers today.

Advanced Hermeneutics (PH603)

A study of the methods of Biblical interpretation; this course teaches the student the principles of rightly dividing the Word of Truth.

Systematic Theology (TH603)

An examination of the doctrines of Bibliology, Theology Proper, Christology, Soteriology, Pneumatology, Angelology, and Eschatology.

Introduction to Christian Counseling (CC205)

An introduction to the basic principles and techniques of Biblical counseling and its application to the ministry of Christian workers. This course will examine basic Biblical foundations for effective Christian ministry.

A Study of the Book of Hebrews (BS103)

This in-depth exposition of one of the most powerful letters in the Bible will reveal much about our relationship with God as we discover Jesus Christ our Great High Priest. The study explores the types and shadows of the Old Testament, which reveal the reality of Christ in the New Covenant. God's plan of salvation will become more clear and meaningful, and our faith made strong.

Victorious Grace: Exposition of 2 Corinthians (BS408-BS508)

The key word in Second Corinthians is comfort or consolation, thus, this study will demonstrate the victorious grace of God, and provide a message of hope for all believers. Upon completion, the student should have a good comprehension of the theme, purpose, and message of the letter, as well a renewed appreciation for the life and mission of the Apostle Paul.

Theology I: A Study of God (TH304)

A study of the divine nature, character, and attributes of God, this course will provide a deeper understanding of God, and an enhanced faith in Him.

The Blood Covenant: God's Covenants with Man (TH102)

An in-depth study of God's Covenants with man. This course will cover the major covenants of the Bible, as well as define in detail God's plan for man's redemption and privileges under the New Covenant.

Grace & Law: Exposition of Galatians (TH307-TH527)

A Scriptural examination of grace and law. This course will contrast grace and law and seek to enhance the student's understanding and knowledge of what is meant by salvation by grace through faith in Christ.

Marriage & Family II: Grace for your Marriage (PM301-PM517)

This course will include a practical, in-depth study of Biblical guidelines for the relationship between the husband and wife. Upon completion, students should better understand God's design for the intimate relationship within marriage and its effect upon establishing a healthy Christian home.
