The Pauline Epistles (BS202)

A study of the Letters of Paul. Emphasis will be upon the background and purpose of each book, as well as the practical aspect of each. This study will examine the problems these epistles seek to correct, examining the methods used and how each book applies to us today.

The Pastoral Epistles: 1-2 Timothy, Titus (BS201)

This study of the Pastoral Epistles will provide an understanding of New Testament leadership and church government. Particular attention will be given to the 5-fold ministry, and their relationship and calling to the body of Christ.

Major Prophets I: Isaiah & Jeremiah (BS303/BS513)

A study of the historical and prophetic writings of Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Lamentations. This study will examine the writer, the theme, and purpose of the writings, as well as their methods of ministry

Pastoral Ministry (PM418)

Shepherdology: An exploration of the biblical and theological shepherding perspective will provide students with an understanding of the heart and nature of pastoral ministry and help equip for the specific functions of ministry and leadership within the body of Christ.

New Testament Survey (BS101)

A study covering the time from the close of the Old Testament through the Revelation. This course is designed to give the student a working knowledge of the background of the New Testament, surveying content as well as the historical setting of each book of the New Testament

Pastoral Theology (PM518)

Biblical Poimenics. This study will examine pastoral theology and provide an understanding of the gift and call of God to Christian ministry. Particular attention will be given to the biblical and theological understanding of the nature and purpose of Christian ministry within the broader context of the nature and mission of the Church.

The Power of Humility (TH350/TH550)

This course will examine the nature and depth of humility, and the joy experienced by those who follow the meek and lowly Lord Jesus Christ (Matthew 11:29).

Stand Firm: Study of I-III John and Jude (BS307/BS527)

A detailed and in-depth study of the letters of I-III John and Jude. A major emphasis in these letters is standing firm in the faith and in truth. While emphasizing the authority and superiority of Christ, this study will deal with the dangers of false teachings and unbelief among Christians, while presenting a message of encouragement and hope for all believers

Theology II: Our Salvation (TH401/TH511) (No prerequisite)

Soteriology: This course will cover salvation as it is considered from man's need, God's provision for reaching out to man, and the application of the work of God in salvation.

Biblical Principles of Leadership II (PM302/PM512) (No prerequisite)

An in-depth and direct study of the principles of Biblical leadership as revealed in the Word of God. Special emphasis will be placed on the character and integrity of a leader in the body of Christ, as well as guidelines for personal growth and development.

Bible Prophecy/Eschatology: Book of Revelation (TH402/TH504)

Using an expositional exploration of the book of Revelation as the foundation, this course will focus on key eschatological events such as the message to the seven churches of Asia Minor, the rapture of the saints, the judgments of the seals, trumpets, and vials, the second coming of Christ, the millennial kingdom, the New Jerusalem, the new heavens and earth, and much more.

Old Testament Survey (BS203)

An examination of each book of the Old Testament from Genesis to Malachi. The date, authorship, purpose, and history behind each book will be discussed, and particular attention given to the writings of the prophets.

Advanced Apologetics (PH702)

This course focuses on developing the student's ability to analyze and critique non-theistic arguments and challenges to the Christian faith and to formulate consistent Christian apologetic responses to them through Biblical research, analysis, and interpretation.

Christology: Doctrine of Christ (TH602)

A study of the Doctrine of Christ, with particular emphasis on the Person and Work of Jesus Christ. This course will provide a detailed analysis of Biblical, theological, and historical perspectives of the person, nature, attributes, work and ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Pentateuch: Genesis - Deuteronomy (BS107)

A study of the first five books of the Bible. A special emphasis will be given to creation, the seed of Christ, and the covenant. This study will provide a good understanding of the plan of God for man.

The Minor Prophets (BS404)

A study of the historical and prophetic writings of the twelve prophets from Hosea to Malachi. This study will examine the writer, historical background, and the purpose and theme of each book.

Theology I: A Study of God (TH304)

A study of the divine nature, character, and attributes of God, this course will provide a deeper understanding of God, and an enhanced faith in Him

Spiritual Discernment (TH446/TH546)

Spiritual discernment is both a spiritual gift (1 Cor. 12:10) and a skill that can be developed and cultivated (1 John 4:1). This course will examine the importance and application of spiritual discernment, enabling students to discern truth from error and to distinguish right from wrong, which will assist in making wise decisions in life and ministry.

Theology Proper (TH514)

This course will address what the Scriptures teach about God, providing a strong theological context into which the practice of one's faith exists.

The Justice of God and the Problem of Evil (TH473)

This study will provide an examination of the nature and extent of the justice of God, as well as the origin and persistence of evil in the world today.

Evil and the Justice of God (TH573)

This study will seek to provide a Biblical account of the justice of God and His dealings with evil, with special emphasis placed on the final victory.

A Study of the Book of Acts (BS104)

An exciting study of the powerful work of the Holy Spirit through believers to establish the kingdom of God revealing the origin and development of the New Testament church.

Church History (TH104)

An exploration of the history of the Christian church. Discussion will include the early development of the church, great revivals and movements, and many important historical events as pertaining to the church.

A Study of Romans (BS304)

An analytical and expositional study of the book of Romans. Special emphasis will be placed upon the historical content of the book, its purpose and doctrinal themes, as well as its practical application in the lives of believers today. Biblical Hermeneutics (PH503)

This course is designed to help equip students and ministers with the tools to increase their skill in interpreting, teaching, and preaching the Word of God. The objective of the course is to prepare men and women who are faithful to the biblical text in their interpretation and ministry.

Intro to Hermeneutics: How to Study the Bible (PH403)

A study of the methods of biblical interpretation; this course teaches the student the principles of rightly dividing the Word of Truth.

The Servant Leader (LD560)

In this course, students will learn the intense value of developing a philosophy of ministry that seeks to serve, support, and empower others in the mutual pursuit of Christ, His will, and His kingdom. Upon completion, students should have a deeper understanding of Biblical leadership, as well as an appreciation for their own gifts and leadership skills that will help them become influential and effective leaders.
