**ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES**

**Great Bible Doctrines (BS102)**

## DOCTORAL LEVEL COURSES

### **Biblical Intertextuality (TH713) \*\*\*NEW COURSE\*\*\***

**TERM A (12 Week Session: April 6 – June 28)**

## ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

### **The Dynamics of the Holy Spirit (TH101)**

Pneumatology: A Biblical examination of the person, work, gifts, and ministry of the Holy Spirit. Special emphasis is placed on the ministry of the Holy Spirit today.

### **Tabernacle & Priesthood (TH409)**

This course will cover the structure and symbolism of Israel's tabernacle and the priesthood. Special emphasis will be given to Old Testament types and shadows and their New Testament reality and meaning, providing a vivid revelation of Christ and his finished work.

### **Unending Joy: A Study of the Philippians (BS390)**

An exposition of the Letter to the Philippians. This study will examine the author, the date of writing, and the theme and purpose of the book. Special emphasis will be given to the practical and personal application.

## MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

### **Introduction to Typology (TH509)**

This course will cover the structure and symbolism of Israel's tabernacle and the priesthood. Special emphasis will be given to Old Testament types and shadows and their New Testament reality and meaning, providing a vivid revelation of Christ and his finished work.

### **Unending Joy: A Study of the Philippians (BS590)**

An exposition of the Letter to the Philippians. This study will examine the author, the date of writing, and the theme and purpose of the book. Special emphasis will be given to the practical and personal application.

## DOCTORAL LEVEL COURSES

### **Systematic Theology (TH603)**

An examination of the doctrines of Bibliology, Theology Proper, Christology, Soteriology, Pneumatology, Angelology, and Eschatology.

### **Biblical Theology (TH703)**

A systematic and critical examination of the historical development of Christian doctrine and spirituality.

## **TERM B (6 Week Session: April 27 – June 7)**

## ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

### **Blood Covenant: God's Covenants with Man (TH102)**

An in-depth study of God's Covenants with man. This course will cover the major covenants of the Bible, as well as define in detail God's plan for man's redemption and privileges under the New Covenant.

### **Theology II: Our Salvation (TH401) *(No prerequisite)***

Soteriology: This course will cover salvation as it is considered from man's need, God's provision for reaching out to man, and the application of the work of God in salvation.

### **The Doctrine of Man (TH419)**

Understanding the nature, fall, and redemption of man is a very important part of any systematic study of theology. Particular attention will be given to the fall of man and salvation through the finished work of Christ. Upon completion, students should have a deeper understanding of the origin, nature, purpose, and destiny of man.

## MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

### **Historical Books: Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther (BS505)**

This course will examine the writer, the date and time of the writing, and the theme and purpose of the books of Ezra, Nehemiah and Esther.

### **Theology of Man (TH503)**

Theological Anthropology: This course will examine the doctrine of man; his origin, nature, purpose, and destiny.

## **TERM C (6 Week Session: May 18 – June 28)**

## ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

### **Old Testament Survey (BS203)**

An examination of each book of the Old Testament from Genesis to Malachi. The date, authorship, purpose, and history behind each book will be discussed, and particular attention given to the writings of the prophets

**The Beauty of Holiness (TH424)**

This course will examine the nature and extent of the holiness of God, and the joy of an intimate walk with Christ experienced by those who pursue fullness in the Christian life.

**American Church History (TH403)**

An exploration of the history, growth, and development of the church in America from the first American colony to the present day. Special emphasis will be given to American Puritanism, great revivals and movements during the nineteenth and twentieth centuries.

**MASTERS LEVEL COURSES**

**The Doctrine of Holiness (TH524)**

This course will seek to provide a deeper understanding of the nature and extent of the holiness of God, while emphasizing the theological and practical aspects of the Biblical doctrine of holiness.

**The Servant Leader (LD560)**

In this course, students will learn the intense value of developing a philosophy of ministry that seeks to serve, support, and empower others in the mutual pursuit of Christ, His will, and His kingdom. Upon completion, students should have a deeper understanding of Biblical leadership, as well as an appreciation for their own gifts and leadership skills that will help them become influential and effective leaders.
