ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

TH473 - The Justice of God & the Problem of Evil

This study will provide an examination of the nature and extent of the justice of God, as well as the origin and persistence of evil in the world today.

TH416 - Theology of the Reformers

TERM A (12 Week Session: September 28 – December 20)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

PM102 - Marriage & Family I

A practical and in-depth study of biblical guidelines concerning marriage and the family. Upon completion, participants should have an understanding of marriage as ordained by God, as well as positive guidelines for developing a happy and successful Christian home.

TH402 - Bible Prophecy: Book of Revelation

Using an expositional exploration of the book of Revelation as the foundation, this course will focus on key eschatological events such as the message to the seven churches of Asia Minor, the rapture of the saints, the judgments of the seals, trumpets, and vials, the second coming of Christ, the millennial kingdom, the New Jerusalem, the new heavens and earth, and much more.

PM403 - Contemporary Issues

This course will examine many of the contemporary issues facing the world today. Such issues as euthanasia, abortion, divorce and remarriage, etc. will be discussed. This course will assist the student in understanding these issues and provide biblical answers in addressing them.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

TH504 - Eschatology: Bible Prophecy

A study of Bible prophecy; this course will examine the things to come regarding the present age, various theories about the tribulation, the return of Christ, the millennial kingdom, the judgments, the new heavens and earth, etc.

PM513 - Christian Values and Ethics

A study of Christian ethics from a biblical perspective. This course examines many of the complex moral and ethical issues facing the world today, providing Scriptural answers for ministry in a post-modern age.

DOCTORAL LEVEL COURSES

TH712 - Pneumatology: Doctrine of the Holy Spirit

Pneumatology: The Doctrine of the Holy Spirit. A study of the nature and ministry of the Holy Spirit, including the person, works, and gifts of the Spirit.

PH603 - Advanced Hermeneutics

A study of the methods of Biblical interpretation; this course teaches the student the principles of rightly dividing the Word of Truth.

TERM B (6 Week Session: October 19 - November 29)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

BS107 - The Pentateuch: Genesis - Deuteronomy

A study of the first five books of the Bible. A special emphasis will be given to creation, the seed of Christ, and the covenant. This study will provide a good understanding of the plan of God for man.

TH381 - Hard Sayings of the Bible

In response to Jesus' teaching, his followers once said, "This is a hard saying; who can hear it?" (John 6:60). This study will provide an in-depth exploration of some of the most difficult, controversial, and challenging passages in Scripture. Emphasis will be placed upon maintaining contextual integrity, while understanding and applying both historical and contemporary relevance.

PH402 - Introduction to Apologetics

This course deals with the nature of Christian apologetics, analyzing some of the major intellectual challenges to the Christian faith, as pertaining to theology and ministry, and assisting students in formulating a consistent and Biblical Christian apologetic.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

TH581 - Hard Sayings of the Bible

In response to Jesus' teaching, his followers once said, "This is a hard saying; who can hear it?" (John 6:60). This study will provide an in-depth exploration of some of the most difficult, controversial, and challenging passages in Scripture. Emphasis will be placed upon maintaining contextual integrity, while understanding and applying both historical and contemporary relevance.

PH502 - Apologetics

This course focuses on developing the student's ability to analyze and critique non-theistic arguments and challenges to the Christian faith and to formulate consistent Christian apologetic responses to them through Biblical research, analysis, and interpretation.

TERM C (6 Week Session: November 9 - December 20)

ASSOCIATE-BACHELOR LEVEL COURSES

TH103 - Exploring the Supernatural: Angelology

An exploration of the realm of the supernatural, including the origin, purpose, and ministry of angels. This study will also reveal the fall of angels, who is the devil, where did the demons come from, and the battle that rages today in the spirit-world.

BS421 - The General Epistles (Hebrews, James, Peter, John, Jude)

The principles of the faith will be examined in this course as we examine in depth the major doctrines of the Bible. Essential doctrines such as the doctrine of God, the Scriptures, the finished work of Christ, the Holy Spirit, eschatology, and many more will be studied in detail.

TH301 - Bible History: How We Got the Bible

Bibliology: This course examines evidences that validate the divine origin and revelation of the Bible, its authenticity, inspiration, canonicity, and inerrancy.

MASTERS LEVEL COURSES

BS501 – Exposition of the General Epistles (Hebrews, James, Peter, John, Jude)

A study of the General Epistles: Hebrews, James, 1-2 Peter, 1-3 John, and Jude. Emphasis will be placed upon the background and purpose of each book, as well as the practical aspect of each. This study will examine the problems these epistles seek to correct, examining the methods used and how each book applies to us today.

TH531 - Bibliology: The Origin of Scripture

The study will inform students of the historicity and accuracy of the Scriptures, which should reinforce the confidence we place in the Bible.
